This 12.83 acre natural area along the Rich Township section of the Old

Plank Road Trail contains 221 different species of prairie plants. The shooting star, wild bergamot, blue flag iris, prairie phlox, and compass plant are just some of the plants growing along the trail. One hundred and seventy five species of birds call the preserve home, as do many different mammals. Be on the lookout for the great blue heron, great egret, coyote, mink, muskrat, and beaver as you enjoy this section of the trail.
